General Information

1. When the driver registers and pays his/her fees for the pull, he/she certifies that he/she has read, understood, and agreed with the rules. The officials will settle any discrepancies in the rules, and their decisions are final and must be accepted in a sportsman-like manner.
2. No refunds of registration fees if disqualified or scratched. The exception is if a class is dropped due to sled malfunction or lack of entrants.
3. All units must be operated on and off track safely. The Director has the right to disqualify and remove keys from any operator acting in an unsafe manner.
4. All units will be parked in the designated area and are not allowed to roam the Fairgrounds.
5. All drivers must wear a shirt, long pants and shoes.
6. Youth operators of all units must be approved by the Director or other representative of the Nokomis Ag Society. All operators under 18 must have written consent from a parent or guardian, and the parent or guardian must be present for the driver to pull. Entrants 10 years of age and older can participate in lawn mower pulls.
7. A parent or guardian may walk beside the unit during the pull for a new driver with the permission of the Director; otherwise, only track officials and contestants are allowed on the track after the pull begins. No helpers or children are allowed in the track area.
8. No consumption of alcoholic beverages by anyone in the track or pull area. If the Director believes any driver to be a potential safety hazard because of erratic behavior, or if they fail to heed a warning for his/her actions, the individual(s) will be removed from the event. Alcohol or glass containers will not be permitted in the pit area. Violators, including drivers and pit crews, will be disqualified and asked to leave.
9. Each participant is responsible for lost or stolen articles, injury or property damage.
10. Changes presented on the day of the event will take precedence over printed material.
11. Keep it FUN.

Rules

1. Pulls are open to any type of lawn tractor powered by gas or diesel engines. Neither nitrous oxide nor pressurized fuels are allowed. Zero-turn units are not allowed.
2. All units are subject to safety and rule compliance inspections by the Director or other representatives of the Nokomis Ag Society; their decisions are final.
3. Units may be checked, weighed or drawbars measured immediately after the pull by the track officials. Anything found out of compliance with the rules at that time will disqualify that pull.
4. A lawn tractor may be used by more than one driver; each driver must weigh and register the tractor.
5. Each unit will have two pulls per class. Reverse order for the second pull.
6. At their discretion, any contestant may opt to advance to a higher weight or CC class. Each weight class will include the machine's weight plus the driver's weight. The driver who weighs in on a tractor MUST drive the tractor in the pull. After the tractor has been weighed and the drawbar height and length checked, no alterations of any kind are to be made to the tractor prior to the pull. No changes to tire pressure are allowed after the tractor has been weighed. If the weight of the driver and tractor exceeds the weight class, they must register in the next heavier weight class.
7. The first puller of each class is the test puller. The test puller can repull immediately after their first pull but must accept the second distance. A repull may be necessary to adjust or reset the sled, at the discretion of the track officials. The decision to re-pull must be made before the machine is unhooked from the sled.
8. When hitching or unhitching to the sled, the unit must be in neutral, and his/her hands raised off the controls.
9. NEW for 2024: All hitches must be a fixed hitch or tractor drawbar and no higher than 13 inches.
10. All pulls will start with a tight hitch. No jerking, swerving or bouncing is allowed.

11. Drivers are not allowed to shift gears or stop to change gears. Hydrostatic transmissions are allowed if they are stocked from the manufacturer. The driver may choose to restart the pull within the first 20 feet.
12. All weights to be fastened securely to the machine. The loss of any object while hooked to the sled will result in disqualification. (NO TARP STRAPS or BUNGEE CORDS ALLOWED)
13. The driver must remain seated in the seat during the entire pull. No portion of the body may extend forward of the handlebars. No bouncing.
14. Disqualification will result if:
 - People are caught cheating.
 - Continuing to attempt to pull after the red flag.
 - The unit and sled are outside marked boundaries; if any part touches the marked line, the driver will be disqualified.
 - If anything falls off the unit while hooked to the sled, the pull will be disqualified.
15. Two tractors must be ready to pull at all times, with one on the track and ready to hook to the sled. A pulling order will be announced, so all drivers will have sufficient notice to be ready.
16. The flag person(s) oversees the track. At the start of the pull, a green flag will be displayed when the sled operator is ready, and the driver may proceed down the track. A red flag will be displayed when the driver must immediately stop. The pull is over when the forward motion stops as determined by the track judge. No one under 12 may act as a flag person.
17. All ties must be pulled off to determine placement.

SHEEP

All Exhibitors must agree to the Participant Waiver and the event rules.

Entries due 5 pm Wednesday before Fair day and must be paid by etransfer by the end of the day Wednesday.

HORSES

General Rules

- All participants must be able to ride a horse independently. A parent can accompany the rider in the ring; however, the rider must be able to control the horse they use for the competition.
- All participants must be wearing approved helmets.
- Proper footwear must be worn on and around horses. Open-toed shoes are not allowed within the arena while horses are present.
- Animal abuse will not be tolerated. Animal abuse will be reported to the Director, who will make the final decision on whether the participant may continue.
- Patterns will be posted at the arena on Fair Day.
- Broken patterns for WeePee and PeeWee will result in a 5-second penalty.
- Broken patterns for Juniors and Open classes will result in no time.
- The start line and finish line are the same for all patterns.
- **Registration is 8:00 am with classes starting at 9:00 am [NEW for 2026].**
- Classes will break after the costume class (free of charge) for the parade. The Nokomis Ag Society encourages all participants to join the parade, free of charge. Horse participants joining the parade will be judged last.
- ***Participants are responsible for their own insurance for this event.***
- Entries may be capped at 75 contestants, with youth being the priority.

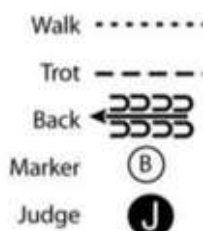
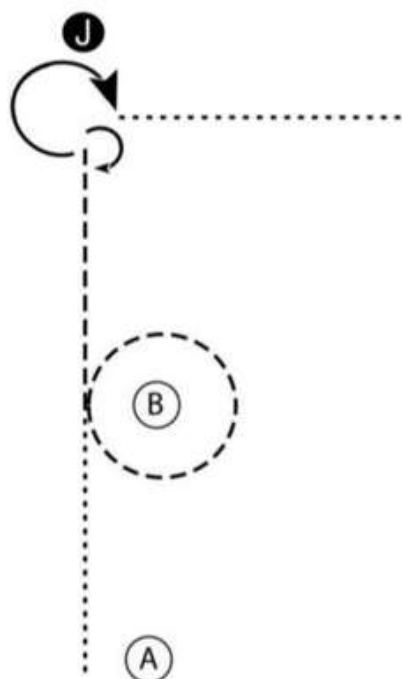

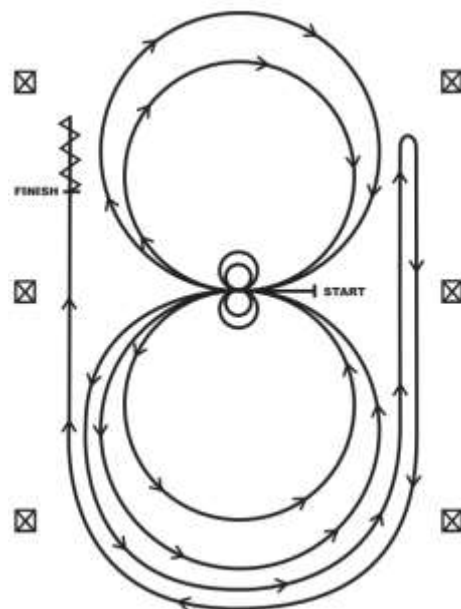
HORSE PATTERNS

Showmanship: Riders will walk from A to B. At B, trot a circle around B and continue to the judge. Stop and perform a 180-degree turn. Set up for inspection. When dismissed, perform a 270-degree turn. Walk straight away from the judge.



Reining:

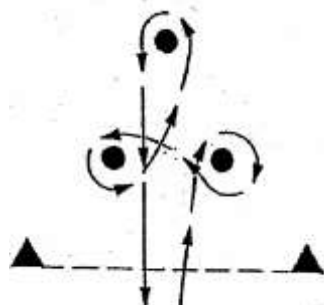
Horses may walk or jog to the center of the arena. Horses must walk or stop prior to starting the pattern. Beginning at the center of the arena, facing the left fence.



- Beginning on the left lead, complete two circles to the left. Stop at the center of the arena. Hesitate.
- Complete two spins to the left. Hesitate.
- Beginning on the right lead, complete two circles to the right. Stop at the center of the arena. Hesitate.
- Complete two spins to the right. Hesitate.
- Beginning on the left lead, go around the end of the arena, run down the right side of the arena past the center marker, stop and roll back right.
- Continue around the end of the arena to run down the left side of the arena, past the center marker. Stop. Back up. Hesitate to demonstrate completion of the pattern.

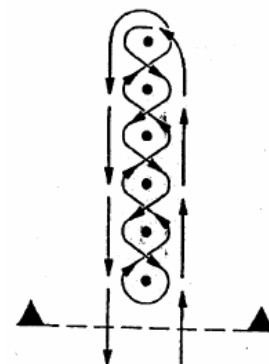
Barrels: Riders will either make one left turn with two right turns or one right turn with two left turns.

- There is a 5-second penalty for every barrel knocked down.
- Disqualification results for broken pattern, running off course or separation of rider and horse will disqualify the rider.

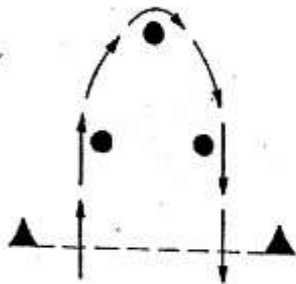


Pole Bending: The pattern may be run right or left. The rider may touch the pole to keep it from going down.

- There is a 5-second penalty for each pole knocked down.
- Disqualification results for the pony turning the pole the wrong way, or if the pole is held by the hand of the rider.



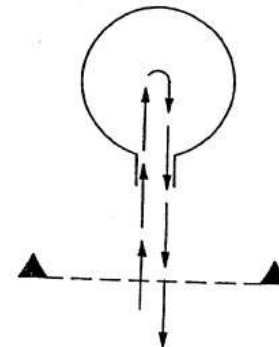
Flag Race The rider will pick up a flag at the first barrel, ride behind the second barrel, place the flag in the bucket at the third barrel and then cross the finish line. Riders can ride left or right.



Disqualifications:

- Failing to pick up the flag on the first pass.
- Failing to place the flag in the bucket on the first pass.
- Hitting any part of the horse with the flag or stick.
- Dropping the flag.
- Knocking over any of the barrels or knocking the bucket off or over the barrel.
- Dropping the flag into the bucket with the flag end down.

Keyhole Race: The horse will cross the timing line, enter the circle of the keyhole, turn around (in either direction) entirely within the circle of the keyhole, and recross the timing line.

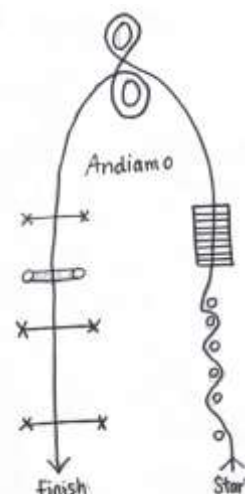


Disqualifications:

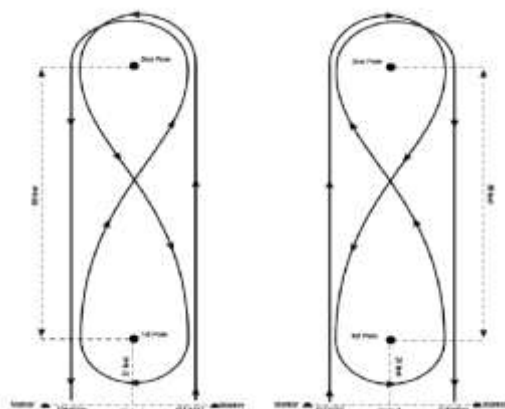
- The horse stepping over the chalk line at any point.
- The horse turns around in the keyhole's throat rather than in the circle.
- Failing to complete the pattern.
- Failing to start or finish between the two markers.

Andiamo is a fun pattern including many different items. First, the rider will weave the pole, then they work the bridge, followed by doing a figure 8 around two barrels. Then over a jump they are to work the gate ending over two more jumps.

- Knocking over a pole or barrel is a 3 second penalty.
- Obstacles such as the gate and bridge have a max of 3 attempts 5 seconds added if failed all 5 attempts.
- WeePee may have assistance with the gate.
- PeeWee, Junior and Adult will receive no time for skipping the bridge or gate.



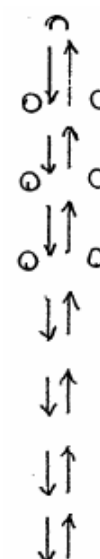
Stake Race Riders start by crossing the start/finish line between the cones, run a figure eight around the upright poles and finish by crossing the start/finish line again and closing the eight. At the first pole, the rider may go left or right.



Key Race The rider will ride through the poles, turn around, and ride back through the poles, and across the timing line.

Disqualifications:

- Knock down of any poles, broken pattern, running off course or separation of rider and horse during the timing period.

1. All entries are done online. Entry forms available at www.nokomisagsociety.com. Contact Sheri Pedersen at 306-528-7969 with any questions or if you are unable to use the online form for any reason.
2. All Participants must accept the Participant Waiver when submitting online entries.
3. Each exhibitor shall pay an entry fee, per entry, as set out in the Fair Book.
4. Exhibitors are allowed multiple exhibits per class
5. The Nokomis Agricultural Society will take all precautions for the health and safety of exhibits and people at the Fair.
6. The Directors shall have the power to postpone the Fair or any part thereof, through stress of weather or for any reason they deem sufficient.
7. Directors in charge of any department shall have the power to disqualify any exhibit for non-compliance with any rules.
8. No person shall act as judge in any class in which he or she is an exhibitor.
9. No person shall be allowed to interfere with the Judges or, by any means, impart undue information while discharging their duties. Exhibitors so interfering will forfeit all right to any prize they might otherwise be entitled to. The director in charge of any class can manage that class during judging.
10. The judge's decision is final in all cases. The secretary has the judging standards.
11. No article will be eligible for more than one prize.
12. If any article or animal is entered in the wrong section of its class, the judge shall have the power to order the entry to the proper section of its class.
13. If any article or animal, in the opinion of the Judge, is not worthy of a prize, the judge's decision shall be final. Articles on display shall not be handled by anyone other than the Director in charge of the Section.
14. All homemade articles shall have been handmade within two (2) years of the show date. Any article may only be exhibited for one (1) year.
15. All exhibits other than livestock, sheaves, cleaned and threshed grains, and forage for feed must be grown or manufactured by the exhibitor.
16. No article shall be admitted with a name, mark, or initial on it. Hobbies and handicrafts that have been initialled, marked, or signed will be accepted in these cases, provided exhibitors completely conceal such initials, marks, or signatures so that no name is visible to the judge.
17. Any exhibitor shall, if required by the Board, make a statutory declaration that the exhibit(s) made by him/her are as shown by the rules and regulations of the Society. If the exhibitor refuses to make such a declaration upon request, all premiums awarded to him/her shall be forfeited.
18. All exhibits, except livestock, must be in the Recreation Centre by 11:00 am on the Friday before the Fair.
19. Horses must be on the grounds by 9:00 am and may leave anytime after 5:00 pm.
20. Cattle must be on the grounds by 10:00 am and may leave anytime after 5:00 pm.
21. Sheep must be on the grounds by noon and may leave anytime after 5:00 pm.
22. All sheep must be penned.
23. All bulls must have rings in their nose or a bull lead and be tied with a neck rope.
24. All horses must be tied to the trailer when not performing, and all stallions must have an extra neck rope.
25. Any exhibit removed before 5:00 pm will forfeit the right to any prize.
26. The Executive's decision will be final in any disputes or infringement of the rules.
27. Any infringement to the rules and regulations may be punished by withholding the prize, expulsion from the Society or both.
